81 County and 44 Township (10 feet or greater)


Gravel Roads 340 miles


- Paved Roads
  - •406 miles
  - ■Pavement condition collected every 2 years
  - Map cracks, crack severity, rutting, ride profile, video log
  - Our latest data was collected in 2022. 2024 data has been collected but is still being processed. Data shown in this presentation is estimated.
  - Roads and bituminous surfacing is huge investment
  - >\$1 million/mile for reconstruction
  - \*\$400,000 for bituminous surfacing
  - Protect the investment


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
## **Pavement Preservation**


- Manage our pavement asset
- Pavements have a life span
- Preservation projects extend pavement life
- Greater benefit/cost for doing preservation projects
  - \* Chip Seal, \$40,000, 7 years, \$6,000/year
  - Overlay, \$250,000, 15 years, \$17,000/year
  - Resurfacing, \$450,000, 30 years, \$15,000/year
- Priority is to keep the good roads in good shape
  - · Not worst first approach
- Like vehicle maintenance


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












# **Pavement Preservation**

- Every year every segment gets another year older
- \*Keep the good roads good in the green
  - Chip seals
  - Overlays
- Keep improving the poor roads in the red
  - Resurfacing (grind and replace)
  - 2025 will address 14 miles
  - 2026 will address 7 miles

#### **SUMMARY STATEMENT:**

On July 31, 2024, an intense storm traversed Southern Beltrami County. The storm caused heavy rainfall and extreme winds. Many trees were toppled and damage was sustained to structures, roads, parks, and other facilities. The County Board declared an Emergency for this event on August 20<sup>th</sup> which makes possible the reimbursement of State and Federal funding for repairs. **SUMMARY STATEMENT:** Solid Waste Crushed a stockpile of crushed concrete in July 2024, per MN Rule 7035.2855 can't store waste in any particular mater for more than 3 years without being processed or utilized. Last time we did this the HWY Department purchased it all for a Highway project that was close by. This time the Highway department doesn't have a nearby use. Recommend we sell to the public.

The Solid Waste Committee has reviewed and approved a rate of \$23/cubic yard.
